






















































#### Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction to Case vs Pulse Duration










Figure 15, Switching Loss Test Circuit and Waveforms





Figure 16, Resistive Switching Time Test Circuit and Waveforms

#### **Typical Diode Performance Curve**






FIGURE 1b, TRANSIENT THERMAL IMPEDANCE MODEL






Figure 2. Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage




Figure 4. Reverse Recovery Charge vs. Current Rate of Change




Figure 6. Dynamic Parameters vs. Junction Temperature




Figure 8. Junction Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage




Figure 3. Reverse Recovery Time vs. Current Rate of Change




Figure 5. Reverse Recovery Current vs. Current Rate of Change




Figure 7. Maximum Average Forward Current vs. CaseTemperature





Figure 9. Diode Test Circuit
